COMPREHENSIVE WATERING BAN IN EFFECT

LEVEL 2

Here's the problem

NO SNOW PACK By June, Vancouver Island was only 3% of normal; this appears to be part of a trend.



LEVEL 3

Very little precipitation or snow pack recharge this winter and spring leaving aquifers vulnerable. This spring was 75% drier than normal.

Reduced ground water supply

LEVEL

Almost no recharge is certain to result in reduced groundwater supply for all well users, not just community water systems this summer and fall.

That includes homes on their own wells and agriculture needs.

Possible salt water intrusion in coastal areas supplied by groundwater.

Areas close to the ocean risk salt water intrusion when water use increases.

Rivers, streams and aquifers are all connected. Stressing

surface water supplies through withdrawals leaves less for aquifer recharge and for fish and the aquatic

habitat they live in. Reducing aguifer levels reduces the ground water that makes its way into rivers and streams which in turn lowers the surface water levels resulting in low stream flow. As groundwater is cooler than surface water it is an important contributor to fish habitat and aquatic health.

Heavy demand threatens:

- · Your drinking water supply
- Fire protection
- Fish habitat

PROLONGED HEAT WAVE Environment Canada

predicts a high probability of higher than normal temperatures for Vancouver Island well into next year.

VERY LITTLE RAIN LIKELY THIS

SUMMER Environment Canada predicts lower than normal precipitation into the fall.

EARLY START TO HEAVY

DEMAND May saw an increase in demand over last year of 63%. Not

normally seen until late July and August. That's over two extra months of high demand.

Water Conservation Level 4 means:

SPRINKLER BAN

NO WASHING OF VEHICLES BOATS, SIDEWALKS, DRIVEWAYS AND NO FILLING OF POOLS, HOT TUBS OR FOUNTAINS.

EVEL

ALLOWED: HAND WATERING OR **DRIP IRRIGATION OF TREES, SHRUBS AND **VEGETABLES [BETWEEN 6-10** AM/PM ONLY]



** Drip irrigation delivers water at the root zone of the plants and uses less than 20 gallons per hour at less than 20 PSI. This does NOT include soaker or weeper hoses, or micro-sprayers. Just DRIP.

COMSERVE

KEEP CALM

AND

SAVE WATER

Vancouver Island is ranked at "extremely dry" drought conditions by the Province.

This is unprecedented.

Reducing outdoor water use is the single most important thing you can do to help.

GO GOLDEN, AND YOUR LAWN WILL BE FINE

You may already have a golden lawn and by doing so you have made a significant contribution to the health of our region and the reliability of our water systems.

REDUCE GENERAL WATER USE

Reduced water use will be needed to help ensure water resources are available this summer and fall and to help reduce stress on fish and aquatic habitats.

More ideas to go beyond a golden lawn include:

- · fix leaks
- add mulch to your garden
- implement Xeriscaping (a style of gardening that requires little or no irrigation)
- · take shorter showers
- · only run washing machines and dishwashers when full
- think about rainwater collection as part of your water supply in the future
- encourage your neighbours, spread the word!
