


Invasive plants are a growing concern because of their widespread impacts on ecosystems. This, in turn, affects the natural resource-based economy of local communities and businesses.

Invasive plants adversely affect crop yields, reduce range productivity because many weeds are non-palatable or injurious to domestic livestock, reduce wildlife forage and recreational values, and impact conifer regeneration efforts. Annual economic losses from invasive plants in BC are in the tens of millions of dollars.

As a follow up to the Weeds Know No Boundaries symposium that the Fraser Basin Council co-hosted in Williams Lake in June 2002, work is now underway to develop a province-wide strategy for the management of invasive plants. The main purpose of the strategy is to help ensure that relevant organizations are working collaboratively to minimize the impact of invasive plants on local economies and community viability.

Development of the strategy has progressed through two multi-stakeholder workshops, one in Richmond and one just recently in Kamloops. Representation at these workshops has included public and private sector interests from throughout the province. The goal is to finalize the strategy by this Fall to ensure that federal, provincial and local government budgeting processes for 2004 can accommodate and support a collaborative approach that addresses this very significant problem before it causes even greater environmental and economic impacts!

In order to complete the preparation of the strategy and to obtain substantial "buy-in" for its contents and implementation plan, the Fraser Basin Council, on behalf of all those interests involved in the drafting of the strategy, is exploring all possible avenues for financial assistance. Such assistance would complement existing core support for the Council provided by its funding partners.

#### PURPOSE

To consider the minutes of the Public Hearing held Thursday, June 26, 2003 with respect to Bylaw No. 500, 293, and further, to consider Bylaw No. 500, 293 for 3<sup>rd</sup> reading.

#### BACKGROUND

Bylaw No. 500.293 was considered by the Board and given 1st and 2nd reading on Tuesday, June 10, 2003.

Bylaw No. 500.293 is a result of an amendment application submitted by Fern Road Consulting Ltd., Agent on behalf of Paul Sarkozy to rezone the above noted property from Residential 1 (RS1) to Residential 2.1 (RS2.1). The purpose of this amendment application is to facilitate the development of a residential duplex on the subject property, with a site area of 700 m<sup>2</sup> per dwelling unit.

The Public Hearing concerning the proposed amendment was held Thursday, June 26, 2003. A summary of the proceedings is attached for the Board's consideration (see Attachment No. 1).

#### **ALTERNATIVES**

- 1. To grant 3<sup>rd</sup> reading to Bylaw No. 500,293 and, upon completion of the conditions outlined in Schedule No. 1, to consider Bylaw No. 500,293 for adoption.
- To deny Bylaw 500.293.

#### INTERGOVERNMENTAL IMPLICATIONS

As required by Section 54(2) of the *Highway Act*, the proposed rezoning must be forwarded to the Ministry of Transportation prior to the Bylaw being considered by the Board for adoption. This section of the Act states that a zoning bylaw under the *Local Government Act* does not apply to land or improvements within a radius of 800 m of the intersection of a controlled access highway with any other highway, unless it has been approved in writing by the minister before its adoption. Therefore, should

the Board grant the Bylaw 3<sup>rd</sup> reading, the Bylaw must be considered by the Ministry prior to consideration of 4<sup>th</sup> reading and adoption.

#### PUBLIC CONSULTATION IMPLICATIONS

No written submissions were received at the Public Hearing. One member of the public attended the public hearing.

#### SUMMARY/CONCLUSIONS

"Regional District of Nanaimo Land Use and Subdivision Bylaw Amendment Bylaw No. 500.293, 2003" was given 1st and 2nd reading on June 10, 2003. A Public Hearing with respect to this Bylaw was conducted on Thursday, June 27, 2003.



#### DISCUSSION

The Select Committee discussed the contents of the Police Finance Discussion Paper and attachments, along with the communications received by other communities regarding their positions on Rural Police Financing. Staff were requested to collect information on the following questions to assist the Committee in understanding the appropriate role for local government in police financing:

- What level of service does community policing provide to supplement basic policing services?
- What are the police finance structures in other provinces?
- What about sharing of fine/ticket revenues with local government?

The Committee then discussed the following questions to assist in developing some general principles:

- 1. What are we paying now?
- 2. What should we be paying in the future?
- 3. How should we pay?
- 4. How much input should we have on community policing?



### What are we paying now?

The Committee was advised that approximately 30% of the rural tax levy collected in Electoral Areas goes towards the cost of policing, the remainder goes towards rural road maintenance. Nothing is collected in municipalities under 5,000. Based on 1994 figures, approximately \$19.8 million was collected from the rural tax levy towards policing costs. The estimated cost in 1998 of providing policing to unincorporated areas and municipalities under 5,000 was \$73 million.

### What should we be paying in the future?

It was agreed that each level of government should pay a proportionate share based on the service that the RCMP spend in enforcing the laws within their jurisdiction. It was noted that there should be some rationale by the province to explain why different rates are applied based upon size of the community and proportion of service.

### How should we pay?

There was discussion as to whether it should be a provincial tax levy (such as a School District tax) or a Regional District tax levy (Regional Hospital District tax) on the tax bill. It was agreed that the tax should show as a provincial tax levy, but that local government may want input as to whether we pay our proportionate share through local property taxes based population, assessment, population/assessment or through a parcel tax.

### 4. How much input should we have on community policing?

The Committee discussed the governance of community policing and agreed that the governance should remain at the provincial level. It commented that there should be open communication between the local authorities and the local police detachment.

The Committee also commented that any Board Policy should re-emphasize that the Regional District will not accept downloading of functions which are clearly a provincial responsibility. It was agreed that prior to finalizing recommendations to the Board, the Committee would wait for the release of the revised Police Financing Discussion Paper and evaluate how the report aligns with the principles developed by the Committee.

The next Committee meeting will be scheduled to coincide with the release of the revised Police Financing Discussion Paper.

#### DISCUSSION

The Select Committee reviewed the minutes of the last committee meeting and discussed the following questions raised at the last meeting:

- What level of service does community policing provide to supplement basic policing services?
- What are the police finance structures in other provinces?
- What about sharing of fine/ticket revenues with local government?

Chairperson Bartram asked whether staff had identified the level of service community policing provides to supplement basic policing services. Staff responded that this information had not been obtained and that it was difficult to quantify. A question was asked as to what credit the Electoral Areas get for providing volunteer services that supplement local RCMP services? Committee members noted that these providing volunteer services that supplement local RCMP services? Committee members noted that these organizations exist both in rural and municipal settings and that it would be difficult to establish a value for the Electoral Areas only. It was acknowledged that volunteer organizations, such as Restorative

Justice, do save a considerable amount in policing costs. While there is a huge community value, the committee agreed that it is unlikely to receive a credit from the Province for these services.

Discussion took place regarding the number of officers and call volumes of each area. The Town of Qualicum Beach has hired Commissionaires to assist in security to supplement a police presence.

The Committee asked whether information had been obtained on police finance structures in other provinces or whether revenues would be shared with local government? Staff commented that the UBCM may have some of that information on other provinces and that the UBCM would be contacted for this. It was not known whether there is any possibility for fine/ticket revenue sharing in the future, but that these questions may be answered at the UBCM Workshop on June 20.

The Committee reviewed the presentation paper and questioned how the caps were determined, i.e., by assessment? What is the basis of calculation on the ability to pay? Is it based on a \$150,000 home? It was suggested that the committee recommend an alternative to the 'ability to pay' formula to determine contributions by each area, such as using by call volumes. It was also suggested that a phase in period be applied, such as a five year period.

Staff clarified that in the Peace River Regional District, they receive a share in gas revenues and have developed a Regional Service for Policing that all municipalities are participating in.

The Committee reviewed the draft Principles developed at the last meeting and agreed to bring questions related to those principles to the UBCM Workshop on June 20, 2003.

#### PÜRPOSE

To ratify service agreements between the Regional District of Nanaimo and the District of Lantzville.

#### BACKGROUND

Section 176(1)(b) and 837 of the Local Government Act allows a Regional District to enter into an agreement with a municipality to provide a work or service that is within the powers of a municipality, Pursuant to the Letters Patent incorporating the District of Lantzville and the Supplementary Letters Patent issued to the RDN, the two parties are proposing to enter into eight (8) service agreements whereby the RDN will administer and enforce certain bylaws and provide specified services for the District of Lantzville. Briefly, the agreements are for the following functions (the complete Service Agreements are available for viewing at the RDN Administration Office);

- Planning and Land Use Management
- Animal Control Services
- Building Inspection
- Bylaw Enforcement
- House Numbering
- Noise Regulations
- Nursance Control
- Unsightly Premises

The District of Lantzville approved the above noted agreements at their inaugural meeting of June 25, The agreements are generally in place to year-end 2004, with the exception of the Planning and Land Use Management Agreement that terminates at year-end 2003 (with an option for renewal).

#### ALTERNATIVES

- 1. To ratify the service agreements between the Regional District of Nanaimo and the District of Lantzville.
- 2. To recommend amendments to the agreements and direct staff to negotiate the amendments with the District of Lantzville.
- 3. To not enter into service agreements with the District of Lantzville.



#### INTERGOVERNMENTAL IMPLICATIONS

Following discussions among RDN staff, the provincially-appointed interim administrator and the District of Lantzville, service agreements have been proposed that will authorize the RDN to continue to provide designated services and enforce specified bylaws within the incorporated boundaries of the District for a set time period. As per the agreements, the RDN shall provide these services at a level equivalent to current service provision in the Electoral Areas. Each agreement sets out terms and conditions as agreed to by the parties. Contributions for these services have been funded for 2003 through Electoral Area 'D' transfers; funding for subsequent years shall be provided by the District of Lantzville. These agreements will allow the District of Lantzville to phase services into place over the next one to two years.

#### VOTING

All Directors – weighted vote.

#### SUMMARY/CONCLUSIONS

As permitted by the Local Government Act, the Regional District of Nanaimo is proposing to enter into service agreements with the District of Lantzville for eight (8) service areas. The agreements are proposed to terminate on December 31, 2004 with the exception of the Planning and Land Use Management Agreement, which terminates year-end 2003. Staff recommend that the Board ratify the agreements; staff will then be authorized to provide these specified services to the District of Lantzville.

#### RECOMMENDATION

That the Service Agreements between the Regional District of Nanaimo and the District of Lantzville for Planning and Land Use Management, Animal Control Services, Building Inspection, Bylaw Enforcement, House Numbering, Noise Regulations, Nuisance Control, and Unsightly Premises be approved.
