Year 2002 Annual Budget

PURPOSE:

To recommend the Year 2002 annual budget and obtain approval and adoption of "Nanaimo Regional Hospital District 2002 Annual Budget Bylaw No. 132, 2002".

BACKGROUND:

The Year 2002 Provisional Budget approved by the Board included a 2% increase in taxation revenues, from \$4,516,840 to \$4,605,000.

This budget does not yet reflect the full impact of debt associated with the construction of surgical rooms at the Nanaimo Regional General Hospital which is now anticipated in 2004. Current low interest rates have affected interest revenues in the budget to a certain degree and staff project that it will be prudent to raise taxes between 5% to 6% for 2003 to account for the new debt which is anticipated in 2004. A further 5% increase is projected in both 2004 and 2005 before the budget stabilizes in connection with this project.

There are no changes proposed to the provisional budget property tax revenues. Accordingly, the budget attached to the bylaw before you reflects \$4,605,000 in taxation revenues and \$1,449,000 for capital grants for 2002.

ALTERNATIVES:

- 1. Approve the 2002 annual budget with a tax requisition of \$4,605,000 and introduce and adopt Bylaw 132.
- Amend the 2002 annual budget and adopt an amended budget bylaw accordingly.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

Alternative 1

Residential property owners will pay about \$37.69 per \$100,000 (\$37.58 in 2001) for this alternative.



Alternative 2

Each 1% change in the proposed requisition would increase or reduce residential property taxes by .38 (thirty eight) cents per \$100,000 of assessment. The only opportunity for budget reductions is in the amount for equipment grants. This amount has risen by 2% for the first time since 2000.

SUMMARY/CONCLUSIONS:

The projected tax requisition for the Hospital District is unchanged from the provisional budget adopted in December 2001. Property taxes raised will total \$4,605,000, an increase of 2% over 2001. Residential property tax rates will rise from about \$37.58 in 2001 to \$37.69 in 2002. Staff recommends the budget as presented.

RECOMMENDATION:

- 1. That the 2002 annual Hospital District budget be approved with property taxes of \$4,605,000 and equipment grants for items costing less than \$100,000 of \$1,449,000.
- 2. That "Nanaimo Regional Hospital District Annual Budget Bylaw No. 132, 2002" be introduced for three readings.
- That "Nanaimo Regional Hospital District Annual Budget Bylaw No. 132, 2002" having received three readings be adopted.
