#### DELEGATIONS AND PRESENTATIONS

Spider Lake Community Association on Developing Access to Illusion Lake Community Park Jack Pipes, Theresa Shuey and Rick Yates presented their concerns about developing access to Illusion Lake Community Park via the end of Shayla Road. Land adjacent to the Park (District Lot 254, Fort Nelson First Nation lands) is a regular site of unauthorized and unwanted partying and trespassing that has disturbed area residents for some years, and the end of Shayla Road is how the miscreants are getting to DL 254. It is feared that development of a trail access into the Community Park at the end of Shavla Road will exacerbate unwanted activities in the general area. The Association expressed interest in creating access to the Community Park via neighbouring Spider Lake Provincial Park, and of facilitating access to Illusion Lake from Spider Lake for 'belly boat' fisherman. J. Michel assured the delegates that there are no immediate plans to develop access to the Community Park, and that the Association is both welcomed and encouraged to participate actively in the planning of any development. Park neighbours are a highly valued resource that RDN Parks relies on for the good functioning of community parks; the POSAC looks forward to working with the Spider Lake Community Association on planning the development of Illusion Lake Community Park.

#### A. Grozell on his Proposed Park Dedication for the McColl Road Subdivision

A. Grozell provided an overview of his park dedication proposal, part of a 25-unit subdivision application concerning lands at the corner of McColl Road and the E&N.

#### APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A required correction to the minutes was noted: the Observer's name is Rick Yates and not Ron Yates. MOVED B. Wilson, SECONDED R. Wahlgren, that the Minutes of the 6 June 2005 Electoral Area 'H' POSAC regular meeting be approved as amended. CARRIED

#### Memorial Donations Guidelines

J. Michel presented a set of guidelines for use in Area H when the public wishes to donate a memorial bench, table or other park improvement. The Committee reviewed the guidelines, R. Wahlgren cautioned about the eventual need for a time limit, and P. Biro suggested an appropriate amendment that would permit the RDN to terminate a donor's association with a memorial item.

MOVED D. Bartram, SECONDED V. Hykawy, that the Area H memorial donations guidelines include the statement; the RDN reserves the right to impose a time limit as the need arises.

#### A. Antonelli

A letter dated 20 August 2005 from Alice Antonelli of Jamieson Road to Director Bartram and P. Biro concerning the exposed tree roots along trails at Wildwood Community Park, particularly along the trail by the railroad tracks, was circulated. J. Michel acknowledged the problem and A. Antonelli's correct understanding that the proper resolution is not to cut roots but to cover them in order to both reduce trip hazards and preserve the health of the trees. J. Michel also noted that the trails in question are actually part of adjacent Lighthouse Country Trail (regional) and this is being addressed through planned development in the short-term (see Standing Reports below). The existence of exposed roots along the trail around Wildwood Community Park will be investigated and addressed at the same time as required.

### BUSINESS ARISING FROM DELEGATIONS, PRESENTATIONS, COMMUNICATIONS AND CORRESPONDENCE

#### Spider Lake Community Association

MOVED D. Bartram, SECONDED R. Wahlgren, that the Spider Lake Community Association be included in discussions regarding the creation of public access to Illusion Lake Community Park.

CARRIED

#### Park Land Dedications and the Subdivision Application Process

J. Michel distributed the RDN policy paper entitled Review of the Consideration of Park Land in Conjunction with the Subdivision Application Process." The paper describes the responsibilities of the POSAC during the review of proposed park land dedications that form part of the larger subdivision application review process.

#### STANDING REPORTS

#### Community Parks

#### (a) Deep Bay Creek Trail Development

The developer, RDN Parks Technician J. Lobb and DFO representatives are scheduled to meet on site to confirm the requirements for the two water crossings in the trail corridor.

#### (b) Illusion Lake Community Park

For some time, residents of Area H have asked the RDN to provide public access to this Park fronting on two lakes. While a trail in to the Park from the end of Shayla Road, and a portage trail to link Illusion and Spider Lakes would not require much development work or funds, community concerns about any improvements at the end of Shayla need to be addressed. The Committee reviewed the issue and agreed that a site visit by Committee members would be useful. Staff will continue to liaise with BC Parks about the possibility of creating access to Illusion Lake Community Park via Spider Lake Provincial Park.

#### (c) Thompson Clarke - Ocean Trail

The Committee discussed the holding of an official opening and agreed that a date in 2006 in conjunction with the first anniversary of the trail would be more appropriate than the fall of 2005. P. Biro and R. Wahlgren asked that the stiles be adjusted in order to better accommodate children on bicycles who are having a difficult time managing the stiles. R. Wahlgren agreed to measure the adjustment required.

#### Beach Accesses (BAs) and Undeveloped Road Allowances (URAs)

B. Wilson provided a progress report on the inventory of BAs. Of those so far examined, many are considered unsuitable for development because they are too steep, the access road too long to develop or too complicated to develop because of gullies and other obstructions. The inventory work will continue.

#### Regional Parks and Trails

- (a) The RDN is partnering with the Community Fisheries Development Centre (CFDC) on a five-person six-month work crew to improve the Lighthouse Country Trail. CFDC will pay for the crew through a grant from Human Resources Canada and the RDN will help fund materials and provide in-kind assistance with the project. Other project partners include DFO and the Nile Creek Enhancement Society. It is expected that the project will begin in December 2005. This work will address A. Antonelli's concerns about exposed tree roots.
- (b) The establishment of regional trail right of way through the Magnolia Court property is advancing. A Ministry of Transportation condition of road closure involving the property was that the Region's trail access through the property be secured by the property owner. The owner has accepted the statutory right of way document developed by the RDN.
- (e) The Fort Nelson First Nation is moving forward with its residential development plans for lands in Dunsmuir on the south side of the Big Qualicum River. Parks staff met with the developer on site and agreement was reached that the regional trail corridor would be accommodated, thus preserving the continuous trail route coming up the undeveloped 1950 Gazetted Highway from Qualicum Beach and linking with the Lighthouse Country Trail in Qualicum Bay and Bowser.
- (d) A report on the Meconella Bluffs sensitive area preservation proposal was circulated to Committee members for their information. The Bluffs are situated within Block 1447, a large piece of resource zoned lands fronting onto Port Alberni at the northwest corner of Area H and the RDN; the property is up for sale. The Bluffs contain a rare white poppy included in Canada's endangered species list. An initiative to see the lands protected is being spearheaded by residents of Port Alberni.
- (e) The poster promoting Rivers Day at Englishman River Regional Park was circulated and activities by all the partners involved with watershed and fish habitat restoration at this new Regional Park were noted. This year, the last Sunday of September is not only BC Rivers Day but also World Rivers Day.
- (f) The recent acquisition of 707 acres of community parkland on Gabriola (Area B) through rezoning involving density transfer was noted.

Director's Update

D. Bartram reported that the Regional Board has approved a \$10/parcel tax throughout the Region (municipalities as well as electoral areas) for the purpose of funding regional park land acquisition. In 2006, approximately \$325,000 in new money from the tax will result in a total regional parks acquisition budget for that year of about \$514,000. By 2011, the annual regional parks acquisition budget is forecast to stand at approximately \$533,000.

741 Mariner Way - San Pareil Water Local Service Area

#### PURPOSE

To present a request for a reduction in a water use invoice at 741 Mariner Way in San Pareil.

#### BACKGROUND

The owners of this property have made a request to have their water user invoice for the summer of 2005 reduced. The invoice for this property for this period is \$3,335.80.

The owners experienced a leak in their irrigation system over the summer months that was not detected. As a result of the leak, an average of 11.9 cubic metres of water per day passed through the property water meter. The average use for that period in the San Pareil neighbourhood was 1.1 cubic metres per day.

RDN policy (see attached) does not allow for reductions in a water user invoice as a result of a leak in an irrigation system. The RDN does provide for a reduction where a leak is in the supply main between the property meter and the house. In this instance staff cannot recommend an allowance be made for this leak under current policy. Only the Board has the authority to allow a full or partial reduction.

This approach is consistent with past requests, the last of which was brought to the Board in April of 2004 where the Board did not allow the request for a reduction. At that time the property owner received an invoice for \$2,603.36 which he contested based on the assumption that the water meter was faulty. After staff had reviewed the file it was determined that excessive use was the cause for the elevated consumption and not the water meter.

Regional District operations and administrative staff have worked with the owner to determine the cause of the leak and outlined the policy with respect to leads on private property. As well, the Manager of Finance reviewed the file and discussed with the property owner his options with respect to the payment of the water use invoice and the implications should the invoice not be paid by December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2005.

#### ALTERNATIVES

- 1. Do not approve the request for a reduction in the water user invoice for 741 Mariner Way.
- 2. Approve a full or partial reduction in the remaining amount payable.

#### FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The owners of 741 Mariner Way have paid \$295.00 towards this account. This leaves \$3,040.80 outstanding at this time. The owner may choose to pay the account in full by December 31<sup>st</sup>, after which the arrears are forwarded to the Surveyor of Taxes for collection.

As the amount paid to date would represent more closely what would have been expected for this property, non payment of the outstanding amount would not result in a reduction of planned revenue for the system.

#### POLICY IMPLICATIONS

Should the Board decide to allow a reduction then a subsequent review of the existing water leak policy will be necessary. To initiate this review the Board can direct staff to review the current water leak policy and to report back to the Board.

A policy review will not be necessary if a reduction is denied,

#### SUMMARY/CONCLUSIONS

The owners of 741 Mariner Way have received a water user invoice totaling \$3,335.80. This invoice is a result of a leak in the irrigation system for the property that occurred over the summer months. This leak was not detected at the time. RDN policy does not allow for the reduction of a water user invoice where excessive consumption is the result of a leak in an irrigation system.

The owners of the property have paid \$295.00 towards the account which represents the average amount that would be expected from this property for the period. The remaining amount is outstanding.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

That the request for a reduction in the water use invoice for 741 Mariner Way be denied,

#### PURPOSE

To describe the conditions under which a water bill adjustment will be made for a water leak.

#### POLICY

Water accounts to a property may be adjusted for an in-ground leak once in a five year period if:

- The property owner advises the RDN in writing that an in-ground leak has been identified and repaired within 14 days of the water billing or from the date the leak was discovered.
- The property owner has provided the RDN with detailed receipts showing proof of repairs
- RDN Utilities personnel have verified that repair work has been undertaken and completed.
- The leak is associated with the main service line from the meter connection to the residence or commercial building. Leaks in attachments to the water system, such as irrigation systems, hot tubs and swimming pools are the responsibility of the property owner and do not qualify for adjustments. Charges relating to leaks from appliances within the building (i.e. toilets, sinks, etc.) do not qualify for adjustment.

For those accounts that qualify for an adjustment, the Manager of Engineering and Utilities, in estimating the account, shall take the larger of the average billing at the property over the past three years (for the billing period in question) or the average for the water system.

**Annual Operating Agreement Amendment** 

#### PURPOSE

To bring forward a proposed amendment to the Annual Operating Agreement with BC Transit.

#### BACKGROUND

The Annual Operating Agreement (AOA) between the Regional District of Nanaimo (RDN) and BC Transit is renewed annually. It provides for cost sharing service arrangements for Custom (handyDART), Community Bus and Conventional Transit. One of the major areas that are cost shared is fuel.

The 2005/06 Nanaimo Regional Transit AOA that was approved in March did not foresee the significant increase in fuel costs. An amendment is being proposed by BC Transit (Appendix A) to the AOA, which would reflect the higher fuel costs and a corresponding increase in cost sharing from the Province.

BC Transit is confident the funding will be approved by the Province later this month. Once BC Transit has this confirmation they will advise regional staff in order that the documents can be executed.

#### ALTERNATIVES

- That when BC Transit confirms that funding for fuel increases has been secured from the Province that the amendment to the AOA be approved.
- 2. That the AOA Amendment be addressed at the time BC Transit confirms the approval of the Provincial cost sharing.

#### FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The AOA will confirm BC Transit's obligation to cost share in the fuel expenditure increases which were incurred between April and the end of the year. If available in time the cost share funding will be accounted for in the year end budgets for transit.

#### SUMMARY

BC Transit has forwarded a proposed amendment to the Annual Operating Agreement to reflect the higher fuel costs and a corresponding increase in cost sharing. BC Transit is confident the funding will be approved by the Province. Once BC Transit has this confirmation they will advise staff in order that the appropriate documents can be executed.

#### RECOMMENDATION

That the 2005/06 Regional Transit Annual Operating Agreement Amendment be approved subject to BC Transit confirmation that funding for fuel cost increases has been secured from the Province.

Further to our discussions, please find enclosed the AOA amendment. The purpose of this amendment is to reflect higher fuel costs in the budget and a corresponding increase in BC Transit and local cost-sharing.

The 2005/06 AOAs were transmitted to you in March with an advisory from BC Transit that there was a considerable risk to the budget because of rising world oil prices and refining margins. BC Transit has exercised options for short term fuel futures contracts to hedge these risks. The resulting diesel prices are lower than the commercial rack price but are still higher than the AOA

The attached AOA schedules reflect provincial government funding to cost-share the budget increase at the traditional cost-sharing ratio. We are confident that we will be able to secure this funding from the Province, but until we receive confirmation of this, the amendment is subject to approval of the Provincial share of funding.

The amendment includes:

- Schedule "C" Budget reflects the increased fuel price in the Variable Distance Cost, the increase in BC Transit funding and the required increase in local funding.

  Schedule "D" Payment Schedule reflects the increased payment per revenue kilometre.

Once we have received confirmation from the Province, we will send the final AOA amendment to you for approval.
