#### **PURPOSE**





# A BYLAW TO AMEND REGIONAL DISTRICT OF NANAIMO LAND USE AND SUBDIVISION BYLAW NO. 500, 1987

- 1. This Bylaw may be cited as "Regional District of Nanaimo Land Use and Subdivision Amendment Bylaw No. 500.364, 2010".
- 2. The "Regional District of Nanaimo Land Use and Subdivision Bylaw No. 500, 1987" is hereby amended as follows:
  - (1) **Schedule '4A', SUBDIVISION DISTRICT MAPS,** is designated from Subdivision District 'B' to Subdivision District 'CC' for the land legally described as:

Lot 24, Block 360, Newcastle and Alberni District, Plan 37698 except Part in Plan VIP64862



#### CALL TO ORDER

J. Stanhope called the meeting to order at 9:30 am and introductions were made.

#### DELEGATIONS

James Craig and Craig Wightman, BC Conservation Foundation, re Englishman River Flow, Fish Habitat and Water Storage

BCCF indicated they are looking toward a working relationship with AWS in the capacity of a water license proponent. This would require AWS to operate and maintain a structure at Shelton Lake in perpetuity. The goal of BCCF is to augment fish habitat downstream with minimal environmental impacts to the system. The December 9, 2010 presentation was re-capped and a question and answer period followed.

- A draft report has been prepared by Kerr Wood Leidel and will be circulated to AWS when finalized. The report is based on the potential project providing between 1-2 m of storage. The Kerr Wood Leidel report will include associated costs for operation and maintenance.
- Parksville and DFO have water extraction licenses on Englishman River together with small domestic license holders at 500-1,000 gallon extraction per day.
- TimberWest owns and operates most of the land surrounding Shelton Lake and has indicated its support. They are willing to contribute to the cause with non-financial resources.
- Shelton Lake access is through Nanaimo Lakes; BCCF have a key for access to Shelton Lake for study purposes.

BCCF is looking for a decision within the year regarding AWS obtaining a non-consumptive license.

Agricultural Advisory Committee Terms of Reference

#### **PURPOSE**

To amend the Agricultural Advisory Committee (AAC) Terms of Reference (ToR) in order to stagger the membership for application based seats filled by community members.

#### BACKGROUND

The AAC existing ToR includes membership representation as follows:

- 2 Members with an interest in agriculture in District 68
- 2 Members with an interest in agriculture in District 69
- 3 Members representing Regional Agricultural Organizations
- 1 EA Director from District 68
- 1 EA Director from District 69 and
- 1 Municipal Director

As per the adopted terms of reference all terms for the seven community members are for two years. As currently structured it would be possible that an all new committee would be established every two years with no overlap of membership. In staffs opinion a staggered membership is preferred as is allows greater continuity for the Committee and their work.

In order to allow for staggering of the membership staff are proposing an amendment to the terms of reference. The proposed amendment will establish a one year term for four of the seven community members for 2011 only. Following this year all terms will return to two year terms. In this manner approximately half of the community members will be appointed each year. The proposed ToR are attached as Schedule A.

#### **ALTERNATIVES**

- 1 To approve the revised Terms of Reference for the Agricultural Advisory Committee.
- 2 To not approve the revised Terms of Reference.

#### FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

There are minimal financial implications as a result of the revised ToR as the advertising for application based seats on advisory committees is currently done on an annual cycle.

#### **SUMMARY**

At present the Agricultural Advisory Committee ToR establishes two year terms for all application based seats filled by community members, with all terms starting and ending on the same schedule. In order to accommodate an overlap of community members and to stagger the appointments, staff are recommending that the ToR be amended. The proposed amendment will establish a one year term, for 2011 only, for the four members with an interest in agriculture. Following this year all terms will return to two year terms.

That the Board approve the amended Terms of Reference for the Agricultural Advisory Committee.

## AGRICULTURAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE TERMS OF REFERENCE

#### GOAL

The Agricultural Advisory Committee's goal is to increase awareness of agricultural issues in the Regional District of Nanaimo and provide leadership in the promotion of agriculture as an important economic driver in the region.

#### **MANDATE**

The Agricultural Advisory Committee is an advisory committee, created by and reporting to the Board of the Regional District of Nanaimo.

#### COMMITTEE ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITY

The primary purpose of the Agricultural Advisory Committee is to:

- Provide comments and recommendations to the RDN Board on items including, but not limited
  to, the Regional Growth Strategy, Official Community Plans, Local Area Plans, reviews of RDN
  Zoning Bylaws, Parks and Trails Master Plans, Drinking Water and Watershed Protection Plans,
  Liquid Waste Management Plans, Rainwater Management Plans, noxious weed/insect control
  referred to the Committee by the Board of the Regional District.
- Promote public awareness of agriculture, its role and economic importance in the community.
- Advocate on behalf of the agricultural community.

#### **MEMBERSHIP**

The Agricultural Advisory Committee will consist of 10 members appointed by the Board of the Regional District of Nanaimo representing a diversity of commodity groups/producers, established regional farming organizations and be residents of the Regional District of Nanaimo.

Members shall be involved in or have an interest in agriculture in the Region and represent diverse backgrounds, interests and expertise.

Members will be selected by the Board through an application process. The application process for committee membership will be promoted through advertisements in local media. Applications must demonstrate the applicant's interest in agriculture, ability to commit the necessary time to the committee.

Membership representation will be as follows:

- 2 Members with an interest in agriculture in District 68;
- 2 Members with an interest in agriculture in District 69;
- 3 Members representing Regional Agricultural Organizations;

- 1 Electoral Area Director from District 68:
- 1 Electoral Area Director from District 69: and
- 1 Municipal Director.

Regional District staff Provincial Ministry staff and Agricultural Land Commission staff shall participate in a non-voting capacity.

#### TERM

The term of appointment for Community Committee Members is two years. Alternate member appointments will be approved by the Committee as required. No substitute members will be permitted. If a member must resign from the committee, their position will be filled through the application process.

In order to allow for staggered terms, for the year 2011 only, the terms of the four appointed Community Members with an interest in agriculture shall be one year terms. Following 2011 all Community Members will be appointed for two-year terms.

No remuneration for participation on the committee is provided but if committee activities coincide with meal times, meals will be provided.

Committee Members having a priority or pecuniary interest in a matter discussed by or are personally affected by a matter discussed by the Committee must declare an conflict and step aside from the discussion and subsequent vote/motion on that particular matter.

#### **DECISION MAKING**

Committee recommendations to the RDN Board will be made by consensus whenever possible. If necessary, votes may be taken and minority reports may be submitted to the Board in addition to the majority opinion.

AAC meetings will be open to the public, however non-AAC members will not have speaking or voting privileges. Delegations that wish to address the committee must seek approval from the committee through a written request. Acceptance of a delegates request to speak to the committee will be at the discretion of the committee.

#### **CHAIRPERSON**

The Chair will be one of the RDN Board members appointed to the Committee in order to provide a direct link between the advisory committee and the Board.
