SUBJECT: Community Wildfire Protection Plan Funding Update

#### RECOMMENDATION

That the Board receive the Community Wildfire Protection Plan Funding update report for information.

#### **SUMMARY**

The outdated Community Wildfire Protection Plans (CWPPs) are a gap in the Emergency Program. On January 27<sup>th</sup> 2017, an application for the Strategic Wildfire Prevention Initiative (SWPI) funding was submitted to the Union of British Columbia Municipalities (UBCM) to update the Regional District of Nanaimo (RDN) CWPP for Electoral Area 'A' and Extension portion of Electoral Area 'C'. The RDN is currently awaiting approval of the funding.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Since 2004, the UBCM has administered SWPI funding to local communities to mitigate risk of Wildland Urban Interface (WUI) fires. The funding stream is used to update CWPPs, which identify wildfire risks as well as opportunities to reduce those risks. Currently the RDN has 10 CWPPs which were commissioned between 2006 and 2008.

On October 4, 2016, the Board directed staff to work with City of Nanaimo staff to determine how the City's Community Wildfire Protection Plan integrates with Electoral Area 'A' adjacent lands. An application for SWPI funding for a CWPP update to include Area 'A' and the Extension portion of Electoral Area 'C' fire protection area was submitted on January 27<sup>th</sup>. In addition staff has initiated communication with the City of Nanaimo concerning their CWPP and the shared boundaries this plan would impact.

Strategic Wildfire Prevention Initiative has two more application intakes throughout the rest of the year, April 28<sup>th</sup> and October 6<sup>th</sup>. Staff will use these intakes to submit applications to update other CWPPs in the region.

# FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

SWPI funding would cover the majority of the cost to update the CWPP and the remaining cost of approximately \$7,500 would be for bylaw amendments, and public administration which are included in the 2017 financial plan.

#### STRATEGIC PLAN IMPLICATIONS

Staff have reviewed the action and noted the items reflect the RDN's Strategic Priorities:

- 1. Focus on Relationships: accomplished through partnering with other branches of community groups to advance our region as well as collaboration with municipal partners on various studies, projects and planning processes.
- 2. Focus on the Environment: by conducting studies to identify hazards, risks and climate change impacts in the region.
- 3. Focus on Service and Organizational Excellence: increased staffing and updating existing practices and plans enhances emergency services contributions to community safety.
